

Hello and welcome to Film and Television Career Launch! My name is Ted Ambrose, and I will be your instructor.

This 9-week asynchronous course will provide you with an introduction to the film and television industry, some of the technical terms used throughout the industry as well as an overview of the different roles in the industry and the types of jobs that are available.
