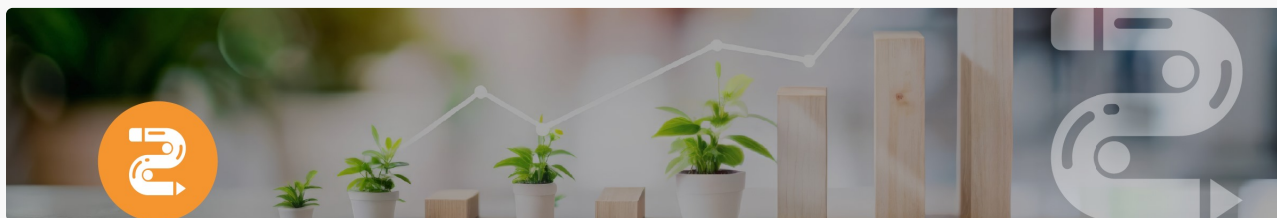

- **Assign** a current trends project to your students. Incorporate a current trends or literature review project and presentation into your course assignments and learn together with your students.
- **Invite** guest speakers to your classes. Both you and your students will benefit from the expertise of invited industry professionals.
- **Join** a professional society special interest group or online meetup. Stay connected with colleagues from near and far through online meetings.
