

Components of the Faculty Portfolio

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1. **Statement of Philosophy of Teaching**

A reflective statement on your thoughts about teaching including your teaching goals for the next few years.

2. **Documentation of your Teaching in Four Domains of the Faculty Standards of Practice**, including reflections:

3. **Classroom Observation**

This form is completed by the Chair and included in the portfolio. Pre- and post-observation meetings are recommended as part of this component.

[A teaching portfolio] includes documents and materials which collectively suggest the scope and quality of a professor's teaching performance.... The portfolio is not an exhaustive compilation of all of the documents and materials that bear on teaching performance. Instead, it presents selected information on teaching activities and solid evidence of their effectiveness. - (Seldin, 2004, p. 2)

Some examples of documents that can be uploaded as evidence are:
