Teaching & Learning Day Fall 2020



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On October 26, the Teaching & Learning Centre held their virtual Teaching & Learning Day Fall 2020 with a focus on assessment strategies. With more than 500 participants, this was the largest attended event organized by the Teaching & Learning Centre Team.

The day started with a keynote presentation from **Flower Darby**. Flower is the co-author with James Lang of the book *Small Teaching Online*. The title of her talk was "Small Teaching Online: Improving Student Engagement, Learning, and Assessment." Flower introduced to us to frameworks to foster connections and community in our online classrooms. She discussed the importance of the community of inquiry framework promoting cognitive presence, social presence, and teaching presence. She also discussed the universal design for learning framework and how to create assessments that foster academic integrity. Flower is working on a new book which will be about harnessing the science of emotion and educational technology affordances to engage our students and to help them learn in meaningful ways.

The session provided suggestions on how to get started on creating authentic assessments and provided exemplars and resources.
