Seneca Libraries is excited to present Leganto, an innovative resources management system, intuitively designed for faculty to effortlessly generate, update, share, and reuse course content. Leganto offers a flexible way to keep all your course materials organized, accessible, and shareable to your students right from their course page.

Why use Leganto?

- Backend support: Receive one-on-one backend support from Seneca Libraries staff not only with using Leganto but also with identifying available resources for your course.
- Textbook alternatives: It can help you replace expensive course textbooks by leveraging the library's digital collection.
- Copyright clearance: It mitigates copyright infringement risks by locating appropriately-licensed materials.
- Easy access: You can access and edit your resource lists from anywhere, anytime.

The fall 2020 pilot went live in mid-September with five courses, made up of 23 sections. A wide variety of faculty participated, including faculty from the Schools of Early Childhood Education, English and Liberal Studies, Hospitality and Tourism, Nursing, and Public Safety.
