With the implementation of the new student system, we have tried to standardize practices and bring consistency to our processes and services across all the campuses. We are also working towards providing a stronger web presence with more online options, fillable forms, and more detailed program and policy information on our website. In 2017, we will be implementing a new service model and queuing system at the Newnham campus that will consolidate all of our front-line services, track our inquiries and provide more effective line management.

All of this will be quite helpful with the provincial government's recent OSAP reforms and the proposed plan to offer affordable tuition to lower-income families.
