This is a self-paced online training module will help faculty and instructors increase their awareness of academic integrity and assist with upholding the [academic integrity policy](#). The module will take between 30 and 60 minutes, and upon completion, participants are eligible to claim Seneca's Academic Integrity Policy badge.
