As part of the Humber-Seneca Polytechnics Partnership (HSPP), the two colleges held a joint Teaching & Learning Day on February 24, 2020 at Seneca's Newnham Campus. There were 180 in attendance from both Seneca and Humber.

The day started with a keynote panel on "The State of Technology in Higher Education," moderated by Holly Cybulski, professor in the School of Media and Seneca's Teaching & Learning Centre. The panel consisted of Stella Bastone from George Brown College, Terry Greene from Fleming College, Greg Rodrigo from Georgian College, and Michel Singh from eCampusOntario. All four discussed their views and perspectives on topics such as

- Burning issues with respect to educational technology

- Preparing professors to teach with technology
- Increasing student engagement

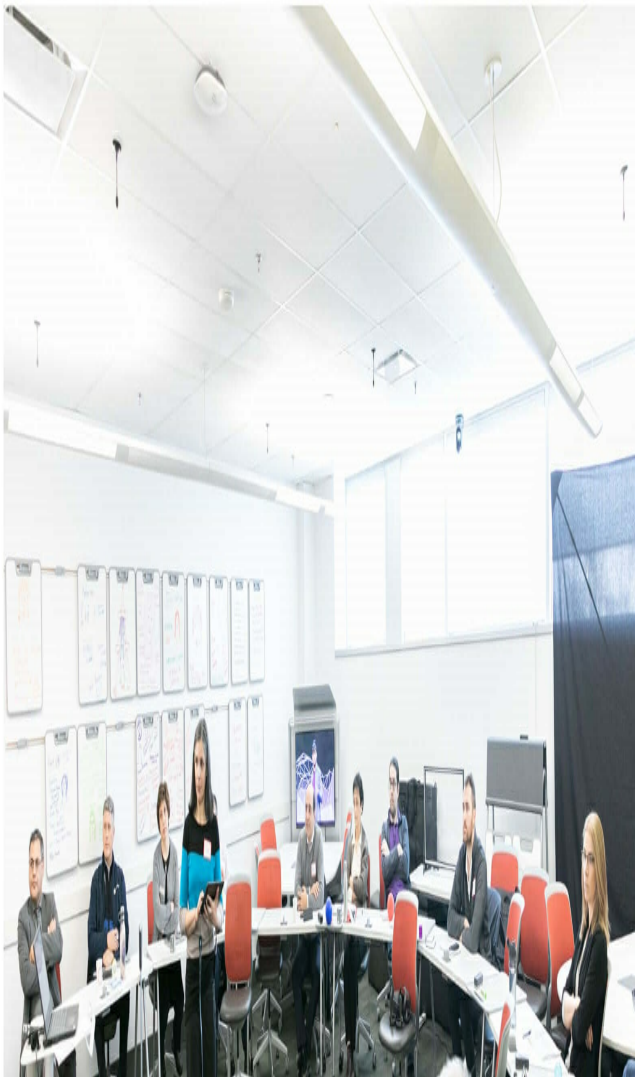

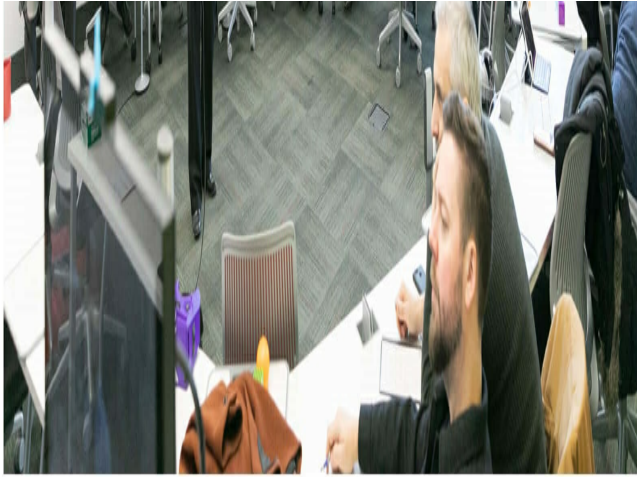
