[Google Jamboard](#) is an interactive whiteboard system. You can write, draw, use post-it notes, images, and more. Share the link to the jamboard, change the permissions to anyone can edit, and students can join you to brainstorm, complete an activity, or just have fun!

Please note: Google will wind down the Jamboard app in 2024. Here are the key dates:

- As of Oct. 1, 2024, you will no longer be able to create new Jamboards.
- Between Oct. 1 and Dec. 31, 2024, existing Jamboards will be placed into view-only mode.
- You will not be able to access your Jamboards on or after Dec 31, 2024.
